

School TV SPECIAL REPORT: Online Gaming



Games are an integral part of human behaviour. It is normal and healthy for young people to engage in play as a part of their daily lives, including playing games online. And like most activities, online gaming can have both positive and negative outcomes. It can be intimidating and confusing for carers trying to understand a young person's online experiences with many considering that staring at a screen is an unhealthy habit. However, the World Health Organisation does believe that as well as the risks, there are also many positive benefits associated with online gaming and these could be key in nurturing bonds with others.

During the pandemic, there was an explosive growth of gaming as people sought much needed connection during isolation. In the media, gaming often gets bad publicity because most coverage tends to concentrate on the minority of gamers who play to such an extent that it compromises all other areas of their life. However, online gaming can teach young people many skills including teamwork, concentration, communication and problem-solving. It requires a level of interaction and skill from the player; unlike watching television, which is more passive.

Online communities provide opportunities for young people to feel socially connected and have a sense of belonging. At healthy levels, gaming can increase their self-esteem and social acceptance. However, any behaviour, when taken to extremes, can also have a negative impact on a young person's everyday life. Understanding what your young person experiences online and knowing the warning signs if they are at risk, will help nurture a more positive relationship with online gaming and help your family find the right balance.

If you are concerned about your young person's online gaming habits, it's important to consider a number of factors. This edition will provide strategies in how to deal with any issues you may be experiencing. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this month's edition, and we always welcome your feedback.

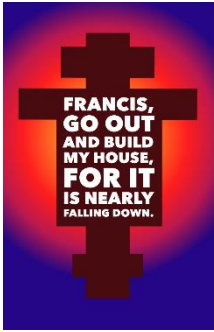

St Francis of Assisi's Feast Day - Blessing of the Animals & St Francis of Assisi Awards



On Tuesday 4 October, our school community celebrated St Francis of Assisi's Feast Day. This was a great celebration for our school, especially as we very rarely get to celebrate on the actual Feast Day. The Blessing of the Animals on St Francis' Feast Day reflects his love of all creatures and all of creation. This was an amazing day with so many of our families and much loved animals being able to join us to celebrate after the two years when we were not able to gather.

We are very grateful to Fr Andrew; our Year 6 Catholic Identity Leaders; the choir; and to our families, students and teachers for bringing along their animals for a blessing and making our St Francis Feast Day such a wonderful celebration.

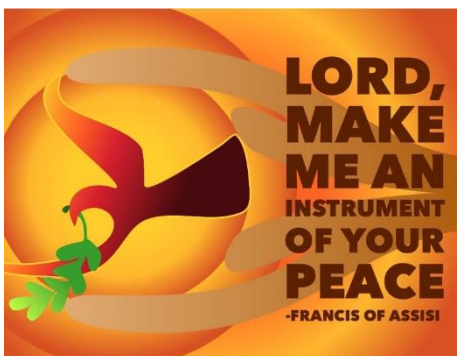
St Francis of Assisi was born in Assisi, Italy in 1181 – and died on 4 October 1226. When Francis was young he lived for money and fun. However, life changed when he was captured whilst fighting in the army at the crusades and put in prison where he became sick. One day, he prayed in a church in San Damiano. He heard Christ say three times from the crucifix, "Francis, go repair my house". By 1209, he had a small band of 'brothers' called Franciscans that were drawn to his simple way of life and his charismatic preaching. He wrote a rule for his Franciscans and gained the Church's approval for his work. The way Francis worked was very different to many at that time in the Church. He helped St Clare found the Order of Poor Clares for women. St Francis started the tradition of the Christmas crib by gathering people to act out the story of Jesus's birth. St Francis of Assisi is the patron of ecology, animals Italy and stowaways.



At St Francis of the Fields, inspired by St Francis we endeavour to foster a respect for creation and take on the responsibility of sustaining this gift from God. Pope Francis, the leader of our Church, who took the name of our great Saint, urges us to live in praise of God, and show respect to all of creation – animals, nature, people – who share our Common Home.

The 2022 St Francis of Assisi Award recipients were announced and presented with their award after the Blessing of the Animals. One boy and one girl from each year level received the Award.

This is not an academic award but an acknowledgment of those students who display qualities of a Christian life just as St Francis did.



The criteria for students chosen to receive the St. Francis of Assisi Award is based on the words of St. Francis: "Preach the Gospel at all times and when necessary use words".

For example, they strive for justice, they are considerate of others, they put others before themselves, they believe in the goodness of others and they live the Good News!

The citations that were read by our teachers certainly reflected the wonderful qualities of the recipients but also the love and great care the teachers have for their students.

We congratulate the recipients of the 2022 St Francis of Assisi Awards.

2. Immediate family of a child whilst enrolled in the school.
3. Present students and their siblings and past students.
4. Families of St Francis of the Fields School can have their loved ones included retrospectively in keeping with 1, 2 and 3.
5. Considered request: When more than one family, group or person requests inclusion, the School Advisory Council will have the discretion to include the deceased's name on the memorial wall.



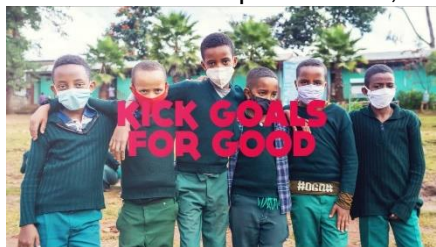
Catholic Missions 2022 Socktober - Crazy or Favourite Sock Day - Kick goals for good!

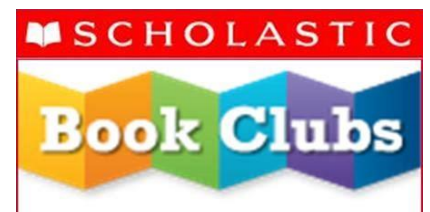
Canticle of the Creatures by St. Francis of Assisi

Literacy News....



This year, the teaching of writing became our whole school focus for professional learning for our teachers, as writing was identified as an area of improvement for our students.

Last term, staff were introduced to a writing approach called “*The Seven Steps for Writing Success*”. This approach fosters student engagement and collaboration in writing, along with using a common language across the school. Teachers make writing fun and successful and the approach has been known to rapidly improve student’s writing skills. Throughout the term, teachers will be introducing their students to the language of the *Seven Steps*, so hopefully the students will be talking about these at home. These steps will also be shared with you through our newsletters each fortnight.

Sevensteps



Step 1: Plan for Success
Seven Steps Writing Tips

Planning is a crucial first step when writing. The difficult part is getting children to do it!

It’s hard to show people how to plan, so here’s a quick method. Good stories (like movies, books, poems and even jokes) are all planned and they all have a similar structure. This is what it looks like:

1. Start with a bang – start with an action scene or at a moment of change.

2. Backfill – the Who, What, Why is filled in while the story unfolds.
3. Pebble – the character faces a small problem or obstacle.
4. Rock – the problem escalates and the tension increases.
5. Boulder – the final tension scene has the reader on the edge of their seat; the stakes are very high.
6. Action climax – the character triumphs against all odds.
7. Emotional resolution – the character's inner story is wrapped up.

Once writers master this basic structure, they can plan more effectively and this will really improve their writing.
