Dear Families,

With the Season of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday next week and the old problem of "What to give up for Lent?" circling around us, perhaps the following might offer some new alternatives:

Parents & Friends Community

Catholic schools receive approximately 80% of the funding of a State school. This means we need to ask parents to pay school fees to make up the majority of the difference. The Parents and Friends Community then fundraise for many of the needs our community wishes to support our students with. Over the past 6 years the P&F has contributed in excess of **\$400,000** across various initiatives including playground equipment, soccer oval and water storage, literacy and numeracy resources, sport and music programmes and many others.

This year our Parents & Friends have committed to purchasing roof-mounted basketball rings for the main stadium. The quotes we have received indicate this investment will be approximately \$25,000.

As you can see our P & F get things done. I invite you to come along to our Parents and Friends meetings each month and help with ideas to support your children. You may even wish to take on a role within the P & F committee. Each year all of the roles become vacant and people are sought to fill the roles. Position Descriptions - Parents & Friends Positions

President

The President is the "key person" who provides leadership using an efficient, enthusiastic and confident manner. The President has the ability to delegate but is still ready to participate and demonstrate strong organisational and interpersonal skills. They need to be a leader of change, a dedicated St Francis person and approachable.

The main responsibilities include:

- Chairing Parents and Friends Community meeting
 - Coordinating the work of the P&F by ensuring:
 - Effective control of P&F meetings
 - o Decision making occurs in a democratic manner and is properly recorded
- Effective communication with parents and staff on important decisions
- Presenting at the Annual General Meeting
- Being well informed on all P&F activities

Vice President

To support the President in his or her role. In the absence of the President, to chair at meetings.

Secretary

The Secretary needs to facilitate and maintain effective communication processes at P&F meetings. This person should be highly organised and a good communicator.

The main responsibilities include:

- Attend P&F meetings and record all Minutes
- Distribute minutes to Principal, Deputy Principal and President and include Minutes in the school newsletter and on Flexibuzz
- Check P&F cabinet for incoming correspondence and distribute to appropriate members or deal with as necessary
- Outward correspondence arrange and follow up and required
- Prepare Agendas with the Chairperson (President)

Assistant Secretary

To support the Secretary in his or her role. In the absence of the Secretary, to take minutes at the meetings.

<u>Treasurer</u>

The main role of the Treasurer is to maintain effective budgeting processes for the P&F.

The main responsibilities include:

- Preparation and presentation of financial statements and reports at P&F meetings
- Accounts and bills paid on time
- Money is banked and recorded as soon as possible after it is received
- Prepare budgets for the forthcoming year describing all sources of income and expenditure
- Maintain accurate records of income and expenditure
- Prepare annual financial accounts for auditing and provide the auditor with necessary information
- All books are kept accurately and up-to-date

Assistant Treasurer

To support the treasurer in his or her role. In the absence of the Treasurer, give the financial report at the meetings.

Fundraising Team

The main role of the Fundraising Team is to coordinate the fundraising calendar. They then delegate the responsibilities of each event to willing participants.

Thankfully 2020 has already been planned for with excellent kits explaining how to coordinate each event. Furthermore, Megan Merrett and Georgina Stevens will still be available to offer advice and support.

School Fees Statements have now been emailed to all families with 2020 School Fees included.

Please note our payment options below. It is expected that parents who do not make payment under Options 1, 2 or 3 will pay their school fees in advance.



OPTION 1 - DIRECT DEBIT PAYMENT OF SCHOOL

Payment of fees by direct debit is the school's preferred option.

This method of payment has proven to be an easy and convenient way to meet school fees with many families already choosing this option.

Direct Debits are available fortnightly (Thursday) or monthly on the 1st of each month. Parents may elect to make monthly or fortnightly payments.

Fee statements are sent home each term, so parents are aware of their balance.

Parents should check at the beginning of the school year that their set payments will meet their fees by end of the school year - please contact the office to make changes. The school cannot automatically adjust direct debit authorities.

OPTION 2 - THREE EQUAL PAYMENTS OVER TERMS 1, 2 & 3

Parents may also pay their account by three instalments - in Terms 1, 2 & 3 (one-third of the annual total).

OPTION 3 - PAYMENT BY REGULAR INSTALMENTS VIA EFT

Payments may also be made by direct deposit to St Francis of the Fields School General Account NAB 083-543 Account 45-717-2080.

Please note your school account number and surname on your Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to ensure your payment is receipted to the correct account. *Example - Cummins 1234*

Your school fee account number is located at the top of your statement above the date.

Repeat - Volunteers for our School Fete.

We are looking for volunteers to help support our School Fete which is one of our biggest fundraisers for the year. It is really important that we get as many helpers as possible for this major school event. Without the volunteers, we would not be able to run this fun day for our students.

The Victorian Government introduced the Child Safe Standards along with Ministerial Order No. 870 which set out the minimum requirements for schools in relation to child safety. Child Safe Standard 4 and clause 10 of Ministerial Order No. 870 relates to staff screening, selection, supervision, training and other human



resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel, including employees volunteers and contractors.

In order to meet the Child Safe Standards the school has prepared 'Engagement of Volunteer' packs, which include all the requirements to meet the Child Safe Standards. We are asking all parents and volunteers who will be helping in and around the school to get a pack from our front office and fill out the required



documents. The Working with Children Act 2005 (Vic) requires that any person doing child-related work, must have a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC). The school already requires that all school volunteers are required to apply for and pass a WWCC. There is no change to this requirement. There is <u>no cost for volunteers</u> applying for a WWCC. Once the documentation is completed, you can choose a time (see below) to bring the documentation back to school and provide the school with proof of personal identity (eg. your driver's license)

After this short process, you will be able to help in and around the school. This process sounds like a difficult or lengthy one however, it isn't and it is ensuring that the safety of our students is at the forefront of everything that we do. We are not able to run events or school activities without the help of our community. We are asking all our parents to please complete the necessary application form.

Please see below for dates and times where we can review your documentation and finish off the paperwork.

Conveyance Allowance Program (CAP) 2020



Education and Training

Dear Parents,

The Conveyance Allowance is a form of financial assistance from the Victorian State Government to assist families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school.

The allowance is available to parents who are required to -

- drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to school (if there is no school bus)
- or drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to meet the nearest school bus to the school
- the child must attend their closest government or non-government school (Catholic)
- the allowance is based on kilometres travelled and not based on any financial eligibility

Distance is calculated by the shortest practical route from home to the school or from home to meet the nearest school bus to the school. Distance can be calculated by using Bing Maps.

Forms required to be completed by a parent are available to download from our website <u>http://www.sfstrathfieldsaye.catholic.edu.au/downloads/forms</u> or can be picked up at the office.

- 1. Conveyance Allowance Application 2020 (one per family which includes all children at St Francis of the Fields)
- 2. Conveyance Allowance Authority to Pay Form 2020 (one per parent claiming)
- Parents who received the Conveyance Allowance in 2019 do not need to complete a new form in 2020 unless their children enrolled at St Francis of the Fields in 2019 have changed (ie Yr 6 student left at the end of 2019 or a Prep child commenced in 2020).
- If your family circumstances have changed a new form needs to be completed in 2020.
- If you have recently changed address, please advise the office if you are no longer eligible.

Application and Authority to Pay forms need to be completed and returned to the office by Monday 24 February 2020 please.

2020 INSTRUMENTAL PROGRAM ENROLMENTS

The Instrumental program is open to all children from Grades Foundation (Prep) to 6. The children are collected from their classrooms for their lessons during school hours on a rotational basis. Lessons are held in the 4 Instrumental Rooms in the Music Centre.






After School Care


