Home Learning

We know that many of you are trying to balance working from home, whilst supporting your children with home learning. This will prove incredibly challenging. Be gentle on yourself, your kids and your teachers. If there is anything we can do to help, please do not hesitate to ask your teacher or Grace Scalora and myself.

Temperature Checks

Next Monday we will begin checking the temperature of all students attending school in accordance with CECV directions. Trained staff will commence the first check at 8.45am each morning. If, as advised, the student has a temperature of 37.5 or above they will be discreetly taken to an inside space where they will be tested after another 15 minutes of quiet time. If the student's temperature is still 37.5 or above the parent or carer will be required to take the child home.

Temperature thresholds and required actions

Temperature reading	Required action
Less than 37.5° C	The student should be advised to proceed to class.
Equal to or greater than 37.5° C on first reading	The student should be asked to wait in a separate room and have their temperature re-checked in 15 minutes.
	If the student is wearing outerwear, the staff member should suggest the child remove this once they are indoors.
Equal to or greater than 37.5° C on second reading	The student should return home with their parent/carer. If a parent/carer is not present, the student will need to be isolated and the parent/carer contacted to collect them from school as soon as possible.
	Families should be encouraged to seek the advice of their healthcare professional who can advise on next steps and COVID-19 testing.

Notifying school of students attending school through PAM

I ask that all parents complete questions via PAM confirming student attendance for Week 7 & 8 (24 August to 4 September). PAM will open on Monday 17 August from 9.00am and close on Tuesday 18 August at 9.00pm. This will allow the school to finalise staffing for Week 7 & 8.

Please remember onsite supervision will only be available to:

- Children whose parents cannot work from home
- Vulnerable children. Vulnerable students are defined as:
 - o children in out-of-home care,
 - children deemed by Child Protection and/or Family Services to be at risk of harm,
 - children identified by the school as vulnerable (including via referral from a family violence agency, homelessness or youth justice service, or mental health or other health service).
- Any child with a disability.

If children are unwell, please keep them home.

Across Victoria, students and their families are experiencing challenging times with the state being in various stages of lockdown yet again. However, this second wave of the pandemic is now also beginning to impact other areas of Australia and New Zealand. Riding this corona coaster and navigating the ups and downs of the current reality is proving to be confronting for many people. The coronavirus has turned our lives upside down with some students returning to remote learning and parents continuing to juggle the home environment.

The uncertainty of not knowing what will happen next may have an impact on many students and their families. There is a concern that mental health issues such as anxiety, depression and substance abuse, will increase, especially amongst young people. In the coming weeks, it will be vital for adult carers to reduce the stress levels at home and make life seem more manageable.

As an adult carer, it will also be essential to look after your own wellbeing during this time. Ensure you make time to de-escalate your own nervous system and maintain your sleep routine, healthy eating habits, get some regular exercise and reach out virtually to friends and family.
