In order to meet the Child Safe Standards, the school requires all volunteers in our school to complete the <u>Engagement of Volunteers</u>


<u>documentation.</u> Part of the requirement is to attend an interview process at the school. (This is an informal chat in the staffroom with either Tim Moloney or Grace Scalora)

During the interview process you will:

- Complete the Engagement of Volunteers documentation
- discuss and sign the school's Code of Conduct document
- discuss the school's Child Safety Policy.
- we will answer any concerns or queries you have.
- complete the short interview process (informal chat)

What do you need to bring?

• The Working with Children Act 2005 (Vic) requires that any person doing child-related work, must have a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC). The school already requires that all school volunteers are required to apply for and pass a WWCC. There is <u>no cost for</u> <u>volunteers</u> applying for a WWCC. This month on School TV - Raising Girls

Raising girls in today's modern world can be a difficult path for parents and carers to navigate. These days, girls are transitioning to puberty a lot earlier than they used to and the physical, psychological and emotional changes they experience are challenging. As a result, by midadolescence, girls are twice as likely to develop mood disorders more so than boys.

Some parents and carers may feel uncertain about how best to support their daughter through the ups and downs of adolescence and how to



keep the lines of communication open. With the rise of social media and technology, mental health difficulties in girls are increasing as often they are faced with online images that make it difficult to see themselves as acceptable. Ensuring a daughter's opinions are heard and her views listened to, will go a long way towards making her feel loved and supported as she tries to establish her own identity.

In this edition of SchoolTV, adult carers will attain a clearer picture of what girls are wanting from their adult carers and how best to support them through adolescence. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this month's edition, and we always welcome your feedback.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Over the next few weeks, we will provide some "family friendly", fun activities targeting Vocabulary.

Vocabulary refers to the words children need to know to understand what they hear and read, and to

communicate. Vocabulary is the most powerful predictor of reading comprehension. Knowing what words mean is essential if your child is to understand what they have read.

1. Don't say it!

Cut out the words below or think of your own words. They might be related to what your child has learnt at school or any words that they are familiar with. Place all the words in a 'hat'. Each person takes a turn at taking out words from the hat. The challenge is to describe the word without using the word at all.

2. Word associations

One player starts by saying a word. The next player says a word that is related to the first word. It can be related in any way. If another player cannot see how the words are related, he/she can challenge, and the connection needs to be explained. Keep going until a word is repeated or a connection cannot be explained. Here's an example: Egypt - Mummy - Dad - beard - Santa Claus - Christmas - trees - leaves, etc.



The Victorian Equestrian Interschool Competition


Anna showed that even in her sporting commitments she was able to show
