Covid Update

All families should now have their second round of RAT tests. At this stage we have not been informed if further RAT tests will be provided to our community. I will let you know as soon as I know.

I ask that you test your child/ren twice a week (perhaps Monday and Wednesday morning) or when your child is feeling unwell.

Please note that students who show symptoms of COVID-19 **cannot** attend school and should get tested immediately and isolate until they receive a negative result. Thank you to those families who have supported our school community by facilitating these measures.

Where a <u>student</u> is a household contact of a positive case (that is, they have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation, or care facility) they must inform the school and isolate for seven days and not attend school during that period. This means that if a parent or sibling has tested positive for Covid then all in the house must isolate for 7 days. If a household contact has tested positive please do NOT send your child/ren to school for 7 days, even if they test negative with a RAT test.

In a bid to keep our children safe we ask that all children in Year 3-6 continue to wear masks when indoors. The children in P-2 may also wear masks, though this is a decision for the parents to make.

I pray these measures help keep our community safe.

Changes to External Service Providers at school.

Due to the increasing demand for services to be delivered at school, we have reviewed our processes for managing External Service Providers (OT's, Speechies etc.) working on site. Parents are now required to request in-school delivery of OT and Speech Pathology through the Learning Diversity Leader, Linda Cartwright.

Tim will make the decision on an individual basis as there are a number of elements to be considered before approval can be granted:

- Is school the best site for the delivery of this service?
- How do the proposed arrangements fit with the student's education program?
- What is the potential impact on other students and staff?
- Individual circumstances of the student
- Limited space due to our building works
- The school's duty of care Child Safe Standards
- What are the current covid regulations for school

Pastoral Wellbeing

Restorative Practices - Our Whole School Approach

Restorative Practices is a whole school approach to promoting resilience and it aims to contribute to the building of positive relationships in our school community. At St. Francis of the Fields, we have been using the Restorative Practices approach for several years. It is focused on helping young people become aware of the impact of their behaviour on others through personal accountability and learning from a conflict situation. An important component of restorative practices is the focus on restoring relationships after harm has been done.

Why?

At St. Francis of the Fields, we believe education is largely about relationships, which can often develop into conflicts which require resolution, forgiveness and healing. Restorative practices helps our students learn from their mistakes and reconcile and resolve problems with others.

As a school, we acknowledge that these prevention measures may lead to and / or require the use of interventions for more serious behaviour infractions. We are also aware that Restorative Practice is successful with children who have empathy. As a result of this, we know that our Foundation to Grade 2 students will develop empathy as their brain develops. With our Foundation to Grade 2 students, we model restoring relationships and forgiveness. We don't expect them to be able to enact forgiveness and the restoration of relationships without guidance and support from the adults around them.

It is hoped that our consistent use of restorative practices at St. Francis of the Fields, will change attitudes and represent a philosophical shift in thinking about students and problem behaviours away from the use of punishment, to the management of situations using a restorative approach.

Students at St. Francis are asked the following questions when a relationship has been fractured:

- What happened?
- What were you thinking at the time?
- What have you thought since?
- Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?
- What do you think you need to do to make things right?



Our Four School Expectations

You will notice around our school, signs with our butterfly logo and four school expectations on them. The butterfly logo was designed by one of our past parents. These four school expectations were voted on by our students, parents and teachers 13 years ago. These school expectations are an important part of who we are as a school and what we stand for. They relate to every aspect of our school life and they give our community a common language that we all understand. You will notice that the recipients of our Student Achievement Awards are awarded to students who display these school expectations.

This week, we ask our school community to be aware of our school expectations with our 'Pick up Zone' and 'Bus'.

Week 4 Wait quietly, watch carefully Pick up Watch and listen to the teachers on duty. Wait patiently, sit with your family and belongings. Stay seated in the designated pick up area. Watch for your car. Get in your car safely and quickly once it has stopped. **Bus** We are respectful of the bus room and each other • Wait silently while we respond to the roll. Leave no trace in the bus room. Walk to the pick up area. Line our bags up neatly in the bus line area. Wear your seatbelt. Use quiet voices.

Lent

On Ash Wednesday 2 March, the liturgical season of Lent begins. We begin our Lenten journey by marking ourselves with ash. Traditionally, this ash is produced from burning the palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday. At St Francis we will burn the palms on Shrove Tuesday. The forty-day Season of Lent concludes on Holy Thursday evening with the Celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.



This is a time to pray, fast and for alms giving - serving others by going without something and contributing that to others or sharing yourself with others in your family, community or globally. Lent is not about getting it perfectly right or focussing solely on self-improvement. It is a time to get in touch with our hope for new life. For the five weeks of Lent, we walk closely with Jesus towards the freedom of Easter. Through prayer we come closer to God so that we are better able to be a source of love and compassion, to live justly as Jesus teaches us. Fasting joins us in solidarity with people experiencing poverty who often have no choice but to go without the basic human needs. Sharing what we have, or 'almsgiving', is a sign of our commitment to justice and our thanks for all that God has given us.

On Shrove Tuesday 1 March, we will have our Burning of the Palms, make our Lenten Promises and have pancakes in our classrooms. A Liturgy of the Word and distribution of Ashes will be held on Ash Wednesday, 2 March. These will be shared with students in classrooms with individual classes or as permitted with the COVID Safe guidelines at the time.



There is no need to return any forms or money to school.


Unique image codes will be issued to all students on/after photo day so families can register online to view images when they become available in the web shop.

Parking and safety around schools

Parking Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community.



The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.

Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.

Conveyance Allowance Program (CAP) 2022



Dear Parents,

The Conveyance Allowance is a form of financial assistance from the Victorian State Government to assist families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school.

The allowance is available to parents who are required to –

- drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to school (if there is no school bus)
- or drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to meet the nearest school bus to the school
- the child must attend their closest government or non-government school (Catholic)
- the allowance is based on kilometres travelled and not based on any financial eligibility

Distance is calculated by the shortest practical route from home to the school or from home to meet the nearest school bus to the school. Distance can be calculated by using Bing Maps.

Forms required to be completed by a parent are available to download from our website http://www.sfstrathfieldsaye.catholic.edu.au/downloads/forms or can be picked up at the office.

- 1. Conveyance Allowance Application 2022 (one per family which includes all children at St Francis of the Fields)
- 2. Conveyance Allowance Authority to Pay Form 2022 (one per parent claiming)
- Parents who received the Conveyance Allowance in 2021 do not need to complete a new form in 2022 unless their children enrolled at St Francis of the Fields in 2021 have changed (ie Yr 6 student left at the end of 2021 or a Prep child commenced in 2022).
- If your family circumstances have changed a new form needs to be completed in 2022.
- If you have recently changed address, please advise the office if you are no longer eligible.

Application and Authority to Pay forms need to be completed and returned to the office by Monday 7th March 2022 please.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.


